# 1. Bradford as Host

The 'City of Bradford' is within Bradford Metropolitan District (MD), which is the fourth largest MD in the UK and covers approximately 142 square miles. It currently has a diverse, multi-cultural population of 531,000 (2011 Census) and is part of the West Yorkshire Urban conurbation, which in 2001, had a population of 1.5 million.

Heritage, Culture, Festivals, Events, Food and Drink; in fact Bradford has something for everyone, what more could you want from a Recovery Walk host and destination? The Walk would also provide much needed 'good news and positive press coverage for Recovery in Bradford' but more importantly, the city as a whole.



Bradford has an impressive history and this is reflected in the striking Victorian architecture found throughout the city. In contrast the newest feature is 'City Park' which is Bradford's multi-award winning high tech water feature and public space. The Mirror Pool is the largest urban water feature in the UK where you can see 100 fountains, laser lights, mist and water effects and much more. The space has gained a reputation for staging a fantastic, high quality programme of events

As the first UNESCO City of film, the Curry Capital, and with Ilkley Moor on the doorstep, many visitors are already attracted to the district each year. Along with The National Science & Media Museum, The Alhambra Theatre and Saint Georges Hall, (the oldest concert hall still in use in the UK) all contribute to the uniqueness of a City developing alongside the many cultures and communities which forms such a diverse population.

Bradford was the first city to have been voted Curry Capital of Britain and in 2016 was crowned again for the sixth year in a row. The city has a well deserved reputation for Asian cuisine so a Bradford curry is a must when visiting.

There is no place like Bradford and a warm welcome beckons, where the fresh air and natural beauty will invigorate you, whilst the heritage and culture will fascinate you. Where else can you enjoy two UNESCO sites, amazing countryside, alongside a city full with a rich and varied mix of cultures and languages.

Bradford is geographically central within the UK within the foothills of the Pennines. It is ideally placed to attract 'new walkers' from both near and far, along with the many thousands who have attended previously, contributing to the success of the 2018 event.

Reaching Bradford by road, rail or air couldn't be easier: Junction 3 of the M606 (links direct to the M62 - junction 26) is only 2 miles away. Foster Square and the City Interchange train stations are within the city centre. Leeds Bradford airport is only 7 miles away.


# 2. Recovery in Bradford is Vibrant

Across the district, there are currently over 4,500 clients engaged with substance misuse services. There is an active and thriving recovery movement which is seen as ', inspirational, sincere and lifesaving' by those within it. There are currently three recovery centres across the district providing safe, comfortable and effective venues focussed on recovery with activities, meetings and training for individuals, groups and families to consolidate and nurture recovery for all

The Recovery in Bradford is vibrant, active and visible throughout the district and closely reflects the approach, aims and objectives of FAVOR. Saving lives, improving the health and wellbeing of individuals in recovery while also reducing and eliminating stigma around addiction, are all integral to the positive commitment of services,

- Bradford wants to host the UK Recovery Walk to:
  - o Demonstrate publicly that 'Visible Recovery 'is 'Out There !!'
  - o Provide an unforgettable experience both for attendees and spectators
  - Positively influence views on Recovery and its often complicated journey.
  - o Reduce the stigma which affects individuals, families and friends
  - o Include the diversity of the local population (recovery & general)
  - o Provide a central geographical location with excellent air, rail and road links
  - o Provide a wide range of accessible and affordable accommodation locally

A new and significant supporter is CGL (Change, Grow, Live), who will be providing the 'New Substance Misuse Recovery System' across Bradford and Airedale from October 2017.



# Bradford Recovery Walk Action Group – 2018

This 'Unique Bid' is from 'The Recovery Walk Action Group' all of whom are individual's with personal experience of local Alcohol and Drug Treatment and Recovery services, Mutual Aid and other similar groups across the Bradford and Airedale district. The bids is also supported by the Local Authority and its Commissioners along with local businesses, other individuals, friends and supporters of 'Wider Recovery'

The Action Group consists of thirteen individuals who have a wealth on knowledge, experience and abilities to make the 2018 Recovery Walk a success. Theses include:

- Political activist and musicians
- Bradford Recovery Radio Hosting and production
- Range of volunteering roles including Recovery services, Oxfam & local mental health services

Regular social events including Comedy Nights, Bands, Plays and Specialist Gatherings held at Unity and Progress (two local dedicated Recovery venues). Throughout the year, many social events are successfully organised including football tournaments, Walking Groups, Trips, Visits and more, for anyone including, volunteers and peer mentors, all of whom are in active Recovery

# 3. Bradford Recovery Walk 2018 – The Route & Occasion

City Park, the destination for the 2018 Bradford Recovery Walk, has a capacity of over 10,000 and is located within the city centre, adjacent to the magnificent City Hall and close to the travel interchange, shopping precincts and the new Broadway Centre.

The Action Group have support from the local authority specialist teams which regularly undertake public entertainment projects similar to the Recovery Walk (both in size and nature) examples include: Bradford Festival, Pride Festival, Bradford Classic, Sky-ride, Big City Play Day, Music in the Park, Bingley and more.

### PUBLIC SAFETY LIASON GROUP - (PSLG)

A Bradford Council led Group consisting of core Council sections with interests or legislation dealing with public safety together with representatives of the Emergency services. The PSLG provide liaison between the various member organisations, enabling the spread of information and the opportunity for each organisation to comment on any issues that affect its work or areas of responsibility. For any event which may affect Public Safety, PSLG advise, communicate plans and offer advice regarding an event.

### **MAJOR EVENTS PROGRAMME TEAM - (MEPT)**

The MEPT, (a department within the Bradford Council) provides help for everyone who plan and organises music events so that they can run safely. They also ensure that organisers understand the needs of others concerned with the event such as local authorities and emergency services. By referring to HSG 195 'The Event Safety Guide' – A Guides to Health, Safety and Welfare at Music and Similar Events, assists event organisers to comply with the law

### The 2018 Recovery Walk - Assembly Point and Route

Pre-walk; Visitors to assemble in the designated area within Peel Park (A 56-acre urban public park in north-east of the city).

The walk is approximately 1 mile/1.6Km long and includes flat and gentle downhill sections giving walkers superb changing perspectives and views of Bradford as they make their way safely towards City Park and the spectacle that awaits them.

It is estimated that the walk will take approximately 1 hour 20 minutes to complete.

In deciding the route, additional considerations included:

- Accommodating attendees prior to and post walk
- Transport management/parking
- Family friendly
- Length, topography and geography
- Time of day, intended duration
- Entertainment, Refreshments/WC availability en-route
- Poor weather contingencies
- First aid, Safety, Security and Highway management

Within our destination of City Park there will be:

- A wide variety of live entertainment
- Activities and something of interest for all,
- A selection of local and international cuisine at affordable prices
- A wider 'market place' to peruse 'Recovery Art', Taste and Try sessions, Body Art and more
- Free water, Sponsorship goodies and more

In addition to the 'Wandering Minstrels' leading the Recovery Walk, a full programme of entertainment is planned and includes local emerging talent and a few 'diamonds' from Bradford 's musical past who will provide for a wide range of musical genres, and tastes. We are also hoping for 'Surprise Guests' to join us on the day.

Hannah Marsden, a Bradfordian, (currently singing with Primal Scream) and her own projects Suki and the Tomcat, an acoustic duet along with her own band The Snides. Additionally, Vanessa Ndubkuba, who 'sings like an angel with a guitar on her back' and Ant Henderson who is making and playing rap gigs locally.

There will also be Music from Mutual Aid bands, Bhangra groups and a variety of diverse cultures entertaining the crowds with dance, and more, from the 'four corners of the earth'.

Bradford was crowned the nation's top city for curry for the 6th consecutive year in 2016 and has a well earned reputation for some of the finest Asian food in the UK. Everyone has a different idea of a perfect curry but we can guarantee somewhere in City Park you will find yours!

A range of stunning locally produced 'Recovery Art' will form the backdrop of a 'special' section within the 'Market Place' to give everyone the opportunity to take time out from the 'Atmosphere of Celebration' and to enjoy a range of personal wellbeing activities and internal reflection.

Mutual Aid groups will also be on hand with dedicated areas for those wishing to take up the option and share their day and experiences with others.

### Especially for the Children & Families:

Within a 'Designated Safe Environment' there will be

- Activities for children where they can be left safely for a limited time\*
  OR
- Activities for children where parents will stay\* Activities include:
  - - Face paintingCraft activities
    - Games: Team type, or Table Top
    - Simple food activities fruit kebabs, biscuit decorating, smoothies( for example)
    - Treasure and other types children's hunts and activities: Including spotting and answering questions the Recovery Walk route,

Additionally, an under three's area\* with suitable toys/activities will arranged within the designated area. \*Subject to approval

### Benefits

Recovery is one of the few opportunities for individuals from such diverse backgrounds to come together with one single aim being common to all. In wider society, community spirit exists in 'pockets' with local communities helping each other particularly in times of need, distress or loss.



### **SPONSORSHIP & FUNDRAISING**

We plan to create a campaign on www.crowdfunder.co.uk to attract fundraising from local communities, the wider recovery community, local organisations and business of all sizes. To assist this, a flexible range of 'rewards based donations' will also be made available and suited to small private donations through to corporate sponsorship packages for businesses large and small.

### Examples

A starter package reward for an individual might cost £10 and they receive a t-shirt and a place on our supporters' wall on the website.

A commercial package for organisations might be 10 delegate places at a cost of £500.

We have flexibility and can offer a wide choice of options so that everyone could participate

Our knowledge and expertise of the on-line Crowdfunder model will produce wider support remotely and with previous experience and skills in creating a full campaign for a 'Democracy Project' will prove useful.
