MUCKHART NATURE PARK

Muckhart Nature Park started out as a Woodland Trust Scotland project. In 2006, the Trust approached Muckhart Community Council to form a Committee who could involve the community with ideas both for starting up and maintaining our own Park.

The committee asked the Primary School and local groups to help create the Park. A competition was held at the school to design a logo and groups of villagers helped to plant and seed the area.

With funding from the Ochils Landscape Partnership and Heritage Lottery Fund, a pond was made, a forum created and trees planted.

Now, eight years on, we are ready to move on to Phase II of the project.

Muckhart Parish Church

Muckhart Church, is in a beautiful setting, sitting elevated from the village, heading towards the Yetts, up on the left hand side. The parish boundary is somewhat unusual and extends to the outer edge of Dollar, some 3 miles west and follows the River Devon. The church that stands today was built in 1838, and is a B listed building. The earliest documented church was in 1560 and some of today's building incorporates some stone from a previous church.



The current congregation has around 100 members with 30 regularly attending, including families with primary and secondary school children. The church regularly organises quizzes, teas, fayres and other social events. The Church was renovated in 2014, and now offers a modern, comfortable and flexible environment.

First aid - Community Defibrillator

Muckhart Church has recently replaced the *First Aid- Community Defibrillator*, which is located in a new external cabinet outside the Coronation hall, and it is available for emergency use by anyone throughout the local community.

A defibrillator can be used to resuscitate somebody who has suffered a cardiac (heart) arrest, where emergency treatment in the first few minutes can be crucial.

In a community such as Muckhart, an ambulance will normally take 15-20 minutes or possibly longer to respond to an emergency, therefore a local defibrillator can be lifesaving in such a situation.

The unit is available for any member of the community to take for emergency use, but please note ***it should only be operated by those persons who have been trained in its operation, and who have also been trained to deliver CPR.***

The faster the treatment the more likely it is to be effective, therefore having household members trained in CPR and in using the defibrillator is the best way of achieving this.

The defibrillator unit is very simple to use, and when activated, provides verbal instructions to be followed by the operator. If you would like to be trained in its operation and CPR, please contact John Anderson, john.anderson781@btinternet.com (tel 01259 781 391)

A number of trained people have volunteered to respond to a request for assistance; however this response team could be more effective if more volunteers were available.

If after training you wish to consider volunteering for the defibrillator response team, please contact John Anderson to discuss it.

On the attached notice you will find:-

- ◆ *a procedure for accessing the defibrillator, which includes the list of current local trained volunteers who have agreed to respond, if available, in an emergency*
- ◆ *the location of defibrillator, and the procedure for collecting it*

Community Defibrillator (updated 22/11/14)

The Community Defibrillator is available for use by anyone
(Anyone operating it, should be trained in 'CPR' & in using the defibrillator)

In the event of a suspected Cardiac Arrest;

1. Phone emergency services (Ambulance service) by dialling 999
2. Do you require help to use the defibrillator?

Only after calling 999, if you think a defibrillator is required, and you require assistance, – phone any member of the defibrillator response team listed below; (If in doubt phone anyway!)

On receiving the call, the member of the response team will ask you:-

- a. *Have you requested assistance of emergency services by dialling 999?*
- b. *to describe the situation*
- c. *Is anyone with you who can collect defibrillator from the Coronation Hall?*

If you have family, neighbours, or a friend who are available to collect the defibrillator from the Coronation Hall, you should ask them to do so as this will make the defibrillator available on the scene more quickly

- d. *Phone a further member of the defibrillator response team for additional support*

3. Collecting the Defibrillator

Defibrillator located at: **Coronation Hall, School Road, Muckhart FK14 7JF**
located in car park, within **yellow cabinet** mounted on wall
adjacent to fire exit (see location map on next sheet)

1. **IGNORE KEY PAD LOCK - Open cabinet & remove the defibrillator unit**
An alarm may be activated when opening door – please ignore

Note: The alarm may be switched off by closing the door and securing the simple clamps

2. If you remove the defibrillator from its location, remember to hang the sign
(DEFIBRILLATOR HAS BEEN COLLECTED) on the outside of cabinet door

Remember, Phone emergency services first by dialling 999
before contacting a member of the response team
(note: Always keep your address and phone number handy)

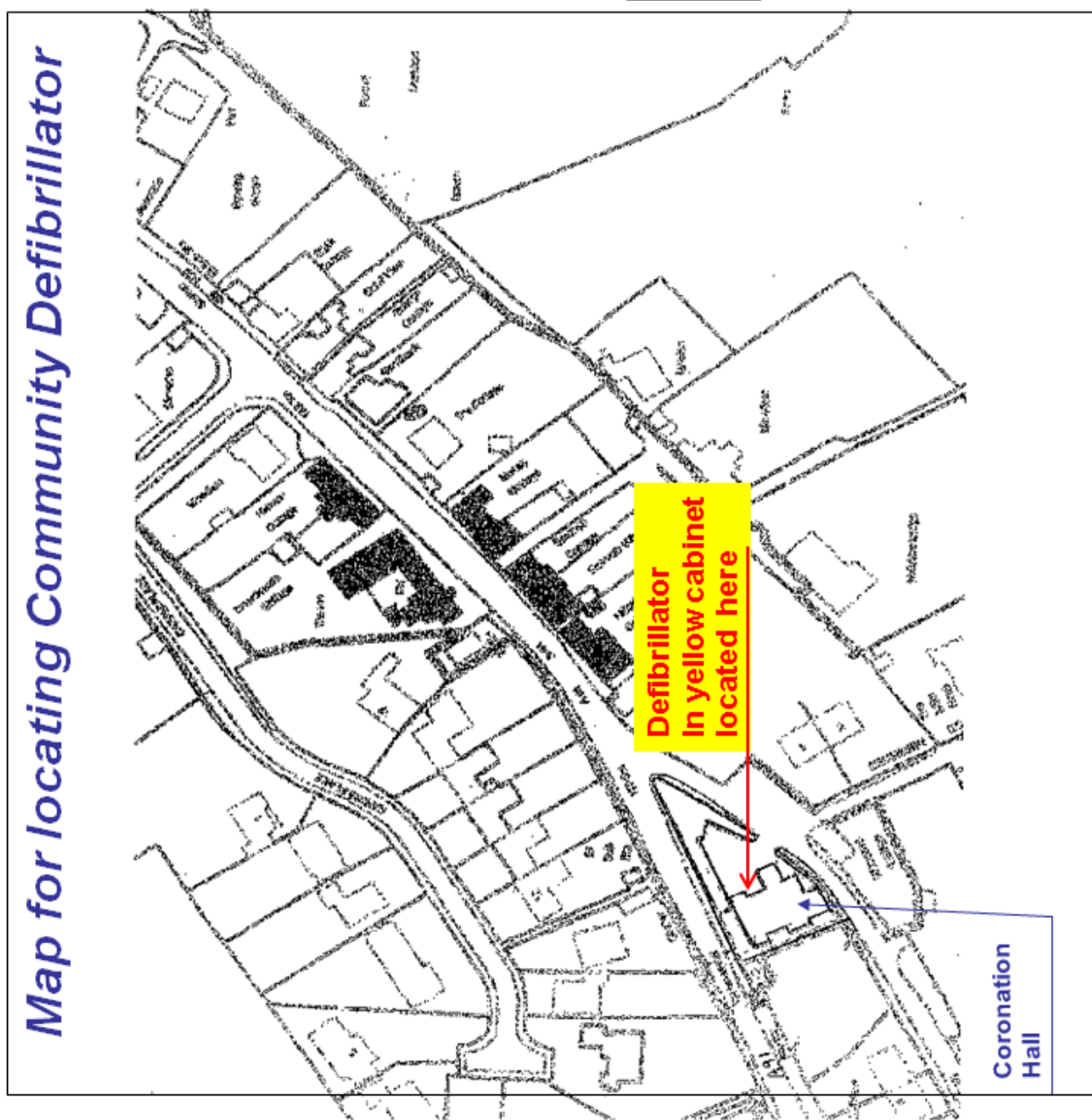
