1. Apologies for Absence

4. Chairman's Report - by John Anderson

JA reported on the year, outlining the various achievements of the last twelve months, noting that MCC was serving the community well and that much progress had been made with the Muckhart Community Plan. JA went on to highlight specific areas of progress which is outlined in the Chair's Report for 2018, appended to these Minutes.

JA ended by thanking all members of MCC and the community who had worked on the various action items in the Community Plan. In particular, he thanked Alison MacDonald for agreeing to work on the Action Plan for Sustainability; Mike Wilson for "keeping the wheels on" MCC, over the year, as Secretary; and Danny Conroy for his diligence as Treasurer. Lastly, he thanked our local Councillors for all of their support over the last twelve months.

5. Treasurer's Report

The audited MCC Accounts, for the year up to 31st March 2018, were presented to members. These showed a balance brought forward, plus income during the year, at £2993.32. During the year, there had been expenditure of £1575.75, leaving a balance carried forward of £1417.57 (which includes a few cheques still to be cashed). The Accounts were accepted with no comments. Ken Bibby was thanked for auditing the Accounts.

Chair's Report 2017-18

It is my privilege to give the Chair's report for the community council for the last 12 months.

1. Community Plan

Probably the most significant event in the last 12 months for Muckhart Community Council was the launch of the Muckhart Community Plan in September 2017 and this by and large is prioritising our thinking and our actions.

The aim of the community plan was to identify, promote and deliver the community's priorities throughout the following 5 years.

A Report detailing the progress we have made in the plan is now available this evening and an electronic copy will be available on the web site shortly.

Therefore I am not going to go through the progress report in detail this evening; I would just ask you to have a look at it. If you read the report I am sure you will agree that the Community plan is working for our community.

You will see significant progress has been made throughout the last 12 months towards delivering the agreed objectives, (of which there are 19, (and each of those is covered by an individual action plan led by a member of the community council). This evening I will just highlight some of the salient points.

2. Scotland's Village in Bloom

Peter Wyatt has been working with members of Amenity Society to move this initiative forward.

Key to a making a successful application will be active volunteers to assist and move the initiatives forward; therefore first priority is to generate interest and commitment from within the community.

A flyer will be sent out soon raising awareness and hopefully generating interest in improving the attractiveness of our village.

3. Community Development Fund/Trust (H2)

The background to this objective is to put in place a development fund where funds obtained for the benefit of the community (perhaps from planning gain), can be effectively managed on behalf of the community. We need a vehicle to do this. (MCC cannot manage funds on behalf of the community).

However we are also taking the opportunity of investigating the options and potential benefits of a "Development Trust", many of those have already been set up in communities throughout Scotland.

The working group led by Patrick are working to the terms of reference set out by the community council and working very hard to produce a report on available options, possibly with recommendations, later this year for the Community Council to consider, and if we think there is merit in taking the initiative further we will then ask the community for their opinion.

A further meeting will be held with Development Trust Association Scotland (DTAS) is scheduled for 26th September and representatives of community organisations will be invited to attend.

It is just not clear at present what benefit a Development Trust will bring to a community like ours, so we will see what the report tells us and take it from there.

4. Development and Planning

We have a Development and Planning Group looking after the community's interests in planning and development matters led by Stuart dean who are kept very busy.

A recent issue which the Community Council have been actively responding to issues re the Japanese Garden specifically in connection to access which was granted along the back road to Dollar.

We fully support this magnificent initiative, but we do have concerns regarding the number of vehicles (which will include buses) travelling along a narrow, safe walking and cycling route (part of the long distance walk the Millennium Way). It does not seem to make sense, however we will be sticking with it to try and assist in resolving the problem (NB Japanese garden is fantastic – well worth a visit)

5. Sustainable Energy and Energy Efficiency (S2)

On Wednesday 19th September at 7pm our sustainability group have organised a public event here in the Coronation Hall, where partner organisations will be demonstrating electric cars and various forms of renewable initiatives, applicable to the domestic homes.

The Energy Savings Trust are managing the event and sending out Flyers to every home in the community.

The Head Teacher and the Parent Council have given the community plan their full support. (Of course they also contributed to it!)

The Parent Council are pro-actively leading on all those issues covered within the Community Plan and MCC will fully support them in their actions.

Unfortunately the school pupil numbers have fallen this year and as a result from September the teaching staff will be reduced to 2 teachers (from 3).

Both the *Parent Council and the Community Council intervened* but regrettably we were unable to persuade the local authority to reverse the decision.

However we do recognise the tight financial constraints the local authority is operating in, but we will do everything we can to support the school.
