Good afternoon,

I hope this finds you well, you will be aware, EDF Renewables UK is building a new wind farm in your area called Burnfoot East. I am writing to let you know that we will be doing a wind turbine blade delivery trial run to the site on Tuesday 9th June.

The trial run will help us determine that the proposed wind turbines blades can be successfully delivered on this route and identify any changes which need to be made to ensure efficient and successful delivery of all 3 turbines in the coming months.

The trial convoy will be made up of 2 police escort vehicles in front of 1 HGV and trailer. The trailer will also have pole attached to the back to replicate the overhang of the largest turbine parts.

The transport haulier will be working closely with Police Scotland to safely control traffic and minimise any disruption, particularly on the A823 between the A9/A823 Roundabout at Gleneagles and the Site Entrance at Glendevon. Based on our previous experience in the area, we are aware of three potential "pinch-point" bends on this section of the route. We expect that there may be delays of up to 10 minutes as the HGV and trailer navigate these bends.

I have included a table highlighting the convoy's journey with anticipated timings; these are dependent on traffic flow in the area at that time.

You have my reassurance we are working with Police Scotland to ensure delays are kept to a minimum and can only apologise for any disruption which may be caused.

APPENDIX - PRIVACY NOTICE

EDF Energy Renewables Limited ("we") collect your personal data from online sources, including government websites, which are a publicly-accessible sources. This privacy notice explains how our organization uses the personal data we collect from these sources. The lawful basis for this is legitimate interests.

We collect personal identification information (your name, email address and (if applicable) position in the community or community group / organisation). We collect the data which is available in the public domain and use this data so we can contact you in relation to the new wind farm we are building in your area, including to keep you up to date with developments and to invite you to certain events such as Community Group Liaison meetings.
